‘One for All, All for One’ is an international ‘graphic medicine’ (comic book & films) project, which engages audiences in Malawi, South Africa, UK African diaspora and beyond around the subject of immunisation, community protection with vaccines, misinformation and research involvement. The ambition was to ‘listen’ rather than ‘tell’ and to use workshops with participants in Malawi to inform the final comics.

- The comics reflect the questions and discussions that took place in the workshops. They are also informed by evidence from science communication and social science research and expertise.
- The aim of this project is to inform and create further conversations around vaccines and immunisation and encourage patients and researchers to think further about how they might collaborate in equitable and positive ways. The comic assets are available for translation into local languages.

Messages in comic:

- There’s a lot of misinformation around vaccines and it’s important to understand concerns as well as reassure. Vaccines go through lots of tests to ensure they are safe and effective.
- Vaccines protect everyone in society through mutual trust and the majority taking them, which leads to ‘community immunity’ (One for All - All for One). This helps protect the most vulnerable people who can’t take vaccines.
- Research into vaccines works best if we all collaborate.

Through enhanced stakeholder ownership of vaccine engagement, the project has the potential to help:

- Engage audiences around vaccine science (including safety and community immunity)
- Encourage conversations about Misinformation
- Engage researchers and audiences in conversations about involvement in research.

ONE FOR ALL, ALL FOR ONE will be available digitally on November 14th and in print and digitally on November 24, 2022.
